Hey, stuff happens. That's why we're excited about our partnership with Aclaimant, a company that specializes in active risk management. We worked with them directly to

develop a reporting system that allows two important things:

- 1) Foremen can easily report incidents, and
- 2) The office can follow up quickly.

The system helps us make sure you get the care you need right away and lose less time away from the job. The system went live this June.

"What can we do?" That was the question that echoed through M&M on the afternoon of Friday, May 20, 2022, when news came that an unprecedented EF-3 tornado (winds up to 150mph) touched down in Gaylord. Homes, businesses, and lives were destroyed. The aftermath left residents with extensive property damage, gas leaks, and loss of water and/or power. Within hours, volunteers and equipment from M&M were on the scene helping first responders with clean up and rescue efforts.
